A 4 mile circular walk from the Royal Oak. The walking route heads out across farmland to reach nearby disused railway track which is very flat, we leave the track on the right and cross onto farmland which belongs to Jim Fletcher. You will be able to enjoy the peace of the rural landscape, there may be a field or two with cows in but with Jim to protect us we shall be fine. We will see 10 acres of fields in which Jim has planted many thousands of trees, to form three woodlands all with the stunning backdrop of the Peak District. We return to the Royal Oak along a short stretch of road and then back along the railway track.

The walk has a few gradients throughout plus one short steep slope. Two stiles and several gates.
